

The Gospel account St. Luke gives us this weekend, is very short on details about the Baptism of the Jesus. We know John the Baptist was baptizing at the Jordan. John acknowledged he was not the Christ; someone greater than him was coming. Then Luke abruptly tells us, Jesus was baptized and at prayer. He tells us a voice from heaven said: "You are my beloved Son with you I am well pleased." This begins the public ministry of Jesus.

On the banks of the Jordan river, Jesus is indistinguishable from those around him. Luke does not make any great fuss or tell us of a dialogue between Jesus and John. Jesus is one of the crowd. He will show complete solidarity with sinners: he will sit and eat with sinners, share his life with them, defend them against heartless religious authorities who would call them unclean and cast them out. As he lived among them, he would die among them, crucified as an evildoer.

The baptism of Jesus was not a cleansing of sin (he is the sinless one). It is Jesus immersing himself into the depth of our human condition and our separation from God's love. His baptism, life death and resurrection was a cleansing of sin and the forging of a new creation. He emerged from death by the glory of the Father. He became one of us, so that we could become like him. By our baptism, into his life, death and resurrection we have touched divinity. "Not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, He saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit". The voice calls us, 'my beloved daughter, my beloved son'. We in turn are to live the call we have received in baptism.

Participate in Pope Francis's Synod at Your Parish this Winter

Pope Francis invites the whole Church to participate in the preparatory process for the upcoming Synod of Bishops on Synodality. This unprecedented opportunity will facilitate discussion and reflection to help shape the Church's understanding of herself and her mission of evangelization and forming disciples. The Archdiocese of San Francisco will kick-off the local synodal process this month by asking every Catholic to participate in the Disciple Maker Index survey.

The process will continue in February and March with engagement sessions offered throughout the Archdiocese. The Disciple Maker Index survey is a nationally recognized survey administered at parishes around the United States and Canada since 2013 by The Catholic Leadership Institute.
