# Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## August 18, 2019

Jesus endured the cross, despising its shame, and has taken his seat at the right of the throne of God. — *Hebrews 12:2*

### FROM THE PASTOR

The first greeting of the Risen Lord on Easter Morning was, "Peace be with you." Every time we come to Mass, we offer each other the sign of peace. Yet, we hear in the Gospel this weekend, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." Jesus appears no longer the bringer of peace or a peacemaker.

Jesus does not accept peace at any price. As his followers, we have to make choices in the light of Christ. These choices can sometimes put us in conflict with the people around us. Jesus had to go through the agony of decision-making in the garden of whether he would accept his baptism of death and resurrection or walk away from the struggle. He demands the same of us.

To follow Jesus Christ is not a stroll in the park, it is not all sweetness and light. It demands commitment and following Jesus on that rocky road to Jerusalem. The Gospel is forcing us to face the fact that if we are followers of Jesus, conflict and division are unavoidable. He never promised us a journey without the cross.

This gospel calls us to stand up and be counted. If we accept Jesus we will be rejected and ridiculed by others, maybe even by family and friends. As the Christian writer C.S Lewis said, "If you want a religion to make you feel really comfortable, I certainly don't recommend Christianity."

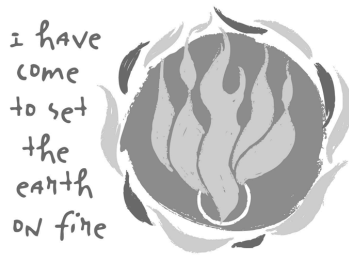

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In recent weeks, we have reviewed how the Churches of East and West have enriched one another, and this past Thursday's solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary was born in the Eastern Church. It is a gift from the ancient Church of Jerusalem, a commemoration of the death of Mary, and a feast charged with a deep sense of the Resurrection. Mary, the first disciple, is the first to share fully in Christ's victory over death. In the tradition of the East, August 15 is the "Dormition of the Theotokos," or the "Falling Asleep of the Godbearer." There is no shadow of death or gloom in the theology, since this is seen as a transformation of Mary's life into a heavenly and immortal existence. There is a sense in the tradition that she who made earth heavenly and exalted the human race by her faithfulness is glorified today.

A persistent legend among Orthodox Christians tells how all the disciples, except Thomas, who was preaching in India, were present at Mary's death and burial, and sat by the tomb for three days. On the third day, Thomas saw Mary's body rising to heaven. She greeted him as "my friend," and he was escorted by angels to proclaim her assumption to the others, who then realized her tomb was empty. Thus Thomas, the one who expressed doubt at the resurrection of Christ, received a gift from Mary: the chance to proclaim resurrection faith to the disciples.
